

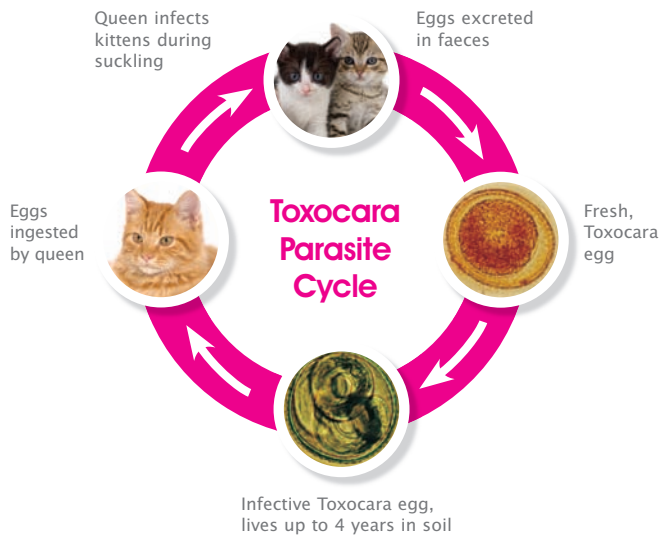
# Pregnant Queens & their Litters

Selecting the wormer that's right for you & your cat

## Panacur Liquid

**Panacur Liquid** is a cost effective way of worming large numbers of cats and kittens, especially if you are a breeder. As kittens can become infected via the mother's milk as soon as they start nursing, it is important to worm the queen prior to mating. After kittening, the queen should be wormed at the same time as the kittens. (See section on kittens)

Although it is recommended to worm queens prior to mating, **Panacur** is **safe to use** during and after pregnancy if required.



**It is important to worm queens to prevent infection of the kittens via the milk**

# Panacur - Parasite Protection for pets

## Have you ever bitten into an apple and found a worm inside?

Because it looked nice on the outside you probably thought it was okay, so it must have been a nasty shock to find a worm hidden on the inside. Well, it's not much different with your pets. They may look healthy on the outside, but on the inside they may have worms too.



Unfortunately, these worms are much worse than the ones you find in apples and they come in many different disguises - **roundworms, tapeworms and hookworms** are only a few of the parasites that can affect your cat. If left untreated, they can seriously harm your cat's health and cause problems such as diarrhoea, vomiting, weight loss and anaemia.

But the problem doesn't just end there - some worms (Toxocara) can be transmitted to humans. Children are especially vulnerable.

Worm eggs are passed in the faeces of an infected cat and can be spread and picked up by other animals or children when they play in parks or gardens. And it's not just a single worm like in your apple - every day these parasites could be shedding thousands of eggs. Not only are they invisible to the naked eye, but because they can survive in the soil for up to 4 years, it's very hard to tell when children are at risk.

## Adult Cats

It is recommended that adult cats are wormed at least every 3 months and Panacur comes in a variety of formulations to help you do this. (see chart on back cover)

### Panacur Granules

Panacur Granules are the easy way to worm adult cats. Simply sprinkle onto your cats food!

## Kittens

If you have a kitten, you'll want to give it the best start in life so it's important to make sure it's wormed regularly.

### Panacur Paste

Kittens need to be wormed more frequently than adult cats.

Panacur Paste is an ideal choice:

- **Easy to administer** - simply squeeze the required dose into your kitten's mouth.
- **Accurate dosing** - As it is a paste rather than a tablet, it is simple to give the exact dose that your kitten requires.

Kittens should be wormed when they are 2, 5, 8 and 12 weeks of age and then **every month** after that until they are 6 months old. After 6 months they should be treated as an adult cat and wormed **every 3 months**.



Kittens should be wormed more regularly than adult cats until they are 6 months of age.
